Drill of the Month

Cat - Mouse

I ran this drill a few times in the recreational league in the fall but I cannot emphasize enough how important I believe this drill to be. This drill is especially useful for the younger aged basketball

players who are still learning to dribble and pass.

Cat/Mouse teaches many basketball concepts to our young players. It teaches seeing the ball and your man, it teaches pivoting, and is useful in stopping kids from traveling which is something all players do when they first begin. Coaches should also focus on spacing the court properly and anticipating where the "Mouse" will be going. All of these are very good skills for our young ball players to learn and this is a fun game they can do in order to learn it.

The game is played typically within the volleyball court markings in the half court. It is a rectangular field of play. The volleyball lines are out of bounds and if the Mouse runs out of bounds they are caught. I like to give each player a chance to be the mouse as this

seems to be the favorite part of the drill to all the young players. One basketball is used and you begin by selecting your first mouse.

Everyone else that is not the mouse are Cats. The object is for the Cats to tag the mouse with the basketball. Be warned and ready for players to accidentally throw the ball at the mouse like dodge ball at first. You cannot throw the ball at the mouse to get them out. Play begins with one Cat having the ball. When you have the ball you cannot move, you can only pivot in attempts to tag the mouse and pass the ball.

The mouse should keep moving trying to avoid being tagged. The cats should be spaced and moving while without the ball, while keeping their eyes on the ball and the mouse at all times. If not, a cat will get struck in the head with the ball. Usually a funny part of the game but it can hurt somebody.

If coaches re-enforce all the items listed and use this drill every practice for 10-15 minutes it is amazing how much it helps young players learn all sorts of things.
